Ashifa Dhanani		<p>Project Updates:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • New water treatment and water distribution definitions • New Classification Model 	<p>Definitions have been clarified & approved by the EOCP Board.</p> <p>The MoH supports the definitions, and will work with the EOCP to arrive at the final definitions.</p> <p>We will work collaboratively with the MoH to bring the definitions to the industry, and with the facilities these new definitions will apply to.</p> <p>Anticipate systems currently classified as WD, with primary treatment, will in the future hold both WD and WT classifications.</p> <p>MoH has developed a framework for a new model. EOCP will review and develop an implementation plan. EOCP partnered with AECOM and Metro Vancouver to do the initial review, and to understand what the new model looks like. The goal is to ensure that the model is consistent, transparent, and focuses on processes while de-emphasizing population.</p>	<p>There will be support, information & background on the EOCP website in the next 2 - 3 weeks</p> <p>Goal for 2015 is to have more information to share with the industry about progress, and a proposed implementation plan</p>

		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Direct Responsible Charge (DRC) 	<p>First direction meeting held June 29, 2015 to develop criteria and templates, and do some consultation to make sure no one who should be getting DRC is excluded, while still maintaining the principles behind DRC.</p> <p>EOPC wants to ensure that Operators and managers are able to implement the proposed DRC plans.</p>	<p>Goal to bring substantial information to the membership by the end of 2015.</p>

This is most likely because WWC became mandatory in 2012.</p> <p>Increase overall in the number of facilities classified.</p> <p>Small decreases in WD due to the analysis of water systems that was done, which resulted in several duplicate entries being removed.</p> <p>Small decrease in WWT where several small WWT plants were decommissioned.</p>

11. Mike Gosselin		Questions from meeting participants	<p>Q. How will EOPC make Operators who are not computer savvy more comfortable with the web based exams?</p> <p>A. Sample exams have been put on the EOPC website to help Operators get used to the interface that is used during the exams. Positive feedback has been received from Operators who had concerns. They like that only one question appears on the screen at a time that they can flag it and go back to it later. They felt it was intuitive and easy to use.</p> <p>Q. Are there any options for Operators who work in WWT plants that run sophisticated water reclamation distribution systems to write WD exams?</p> <p>A. No concrete decisions have been made. Follow up after the meeting to obtain more information.</p>	

			<p>Q. Are there any options for Operators in smaller communities who do not meet the high school requirement to become certified Operators?</p> <p>A. The high school graduation requirement was added to be consistent with the other Canadian provinces. It is important for BC to have similar requirements to maintain mobility for Operators to move and have their certifications recognized in other provinces. More information about how to obtain an adult graduation diploma will be put on the EOCP website.</p>
